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### Catalog Description

Continued study and application of the methods and components of theatrical production, which may include one or more of the following: theater facilities, scenery construction and painting, properties, lighting, costume, makeup, sound and theatrical management. This course will focus on stage lighting, sound and to a lesser extent costume.

# Objectives

Upon successful completion of this course, students will:

- 1. Apply an expanded vocabulary and knowledge of the environment, tools, and skills required to mount a theatrical production.
- 2. Demonstrate an increased knowledge of the variety of work required to mount a theatrical production.
- 3. Describe in depth the collaborative nature of production within theatre arts.

### Course Structure

The class will consist of lectures and practical applications. Projects will be assigned and there will be tests given.
